Parents' Evenings are one part of our engagement with you as parents and carers. We are committed to developing our relationship with you which is why we are, this year, working towards a Parent Partnership award. We will be reviewing all of our communications as well as exploring different ways to engage with you. If you do not have the Edulink app, please take the time to download it as you can access useful information about your child's progress at school. If you have not logged on to Edulink already we will be sending you an email invite this week - please watch out for it, the invite may go into your spam folder! We will be developing our use of this excellent app during the coming year.

If you would be interested in coming to school during the day to look around, please let us know and we will organise someone to host you. We would very much like to offer parents and carers the chance to experience the school whilst we are all here! It could support your children in talking to you about their experiences at school. You may be aware of the government's recent guidance on school uniform. This states that second hand uniform should be available, which we have had in place for a while now. We would like to replenish our stocks. If you have any good quality uniform to donate, please drop it off at reception and if you require anything please contact us at school. The guidance also asks schools to review their school uniform with a particular focus on cost. We are currently considering changes for September 2023 which will reduce the cost to parents and carers. We will be limiting required branded items to two things, ensuring all other required items are easy to purchase from supermarkets, department stores or online.

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This will also apply to PE kit. We are planning to have more than one supplier for any branded items in order to secure good value for money. The purpose of these changes will be to reduce cost, whilst also maintaining the school identity and ensuring an inclusive environment. Any changes will be phased into place and students with current uniform will be able to continue to wear it. It will not be necessary to purchase a completely new uniform. There have been some initial discussions with students and staff about changes. If you have any views which you would like to share with us, please let us know using hello@gra.hslt.academy.

We are maintaining our strong focus on improving attendance at school. I am pleased that we have seen some improvements compared to last year but we still have some progress to make. Good attendance is so crucial, not only for academic progress but also to support mental health and wellbeing. Please continue to send your children to school every day!

I would like to wish everyone an enjoyable break, whilst also appreciating that we are living in difficult times.
